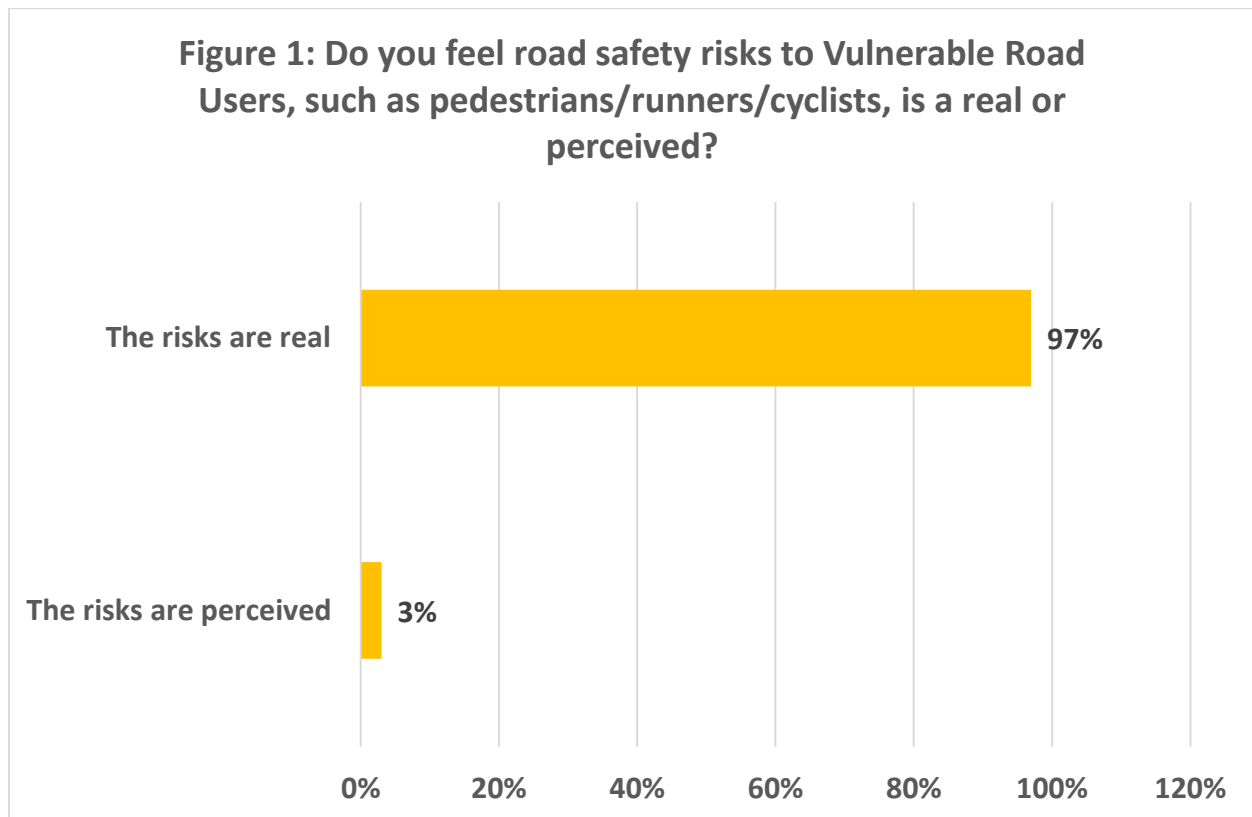


1. Overview of current report

The current report highlights the insights acquired from the AA visibility campaign survey.

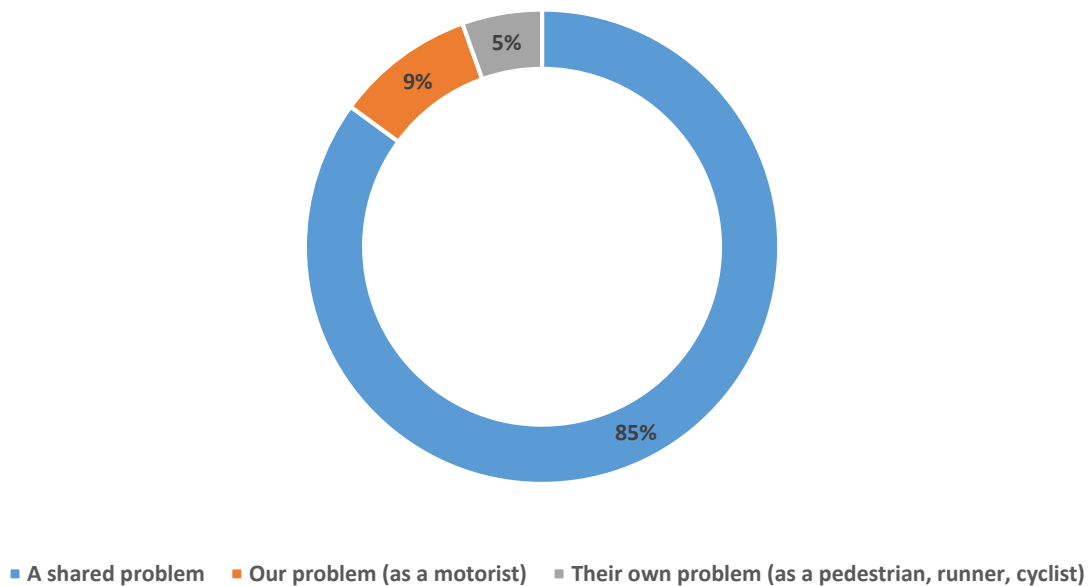

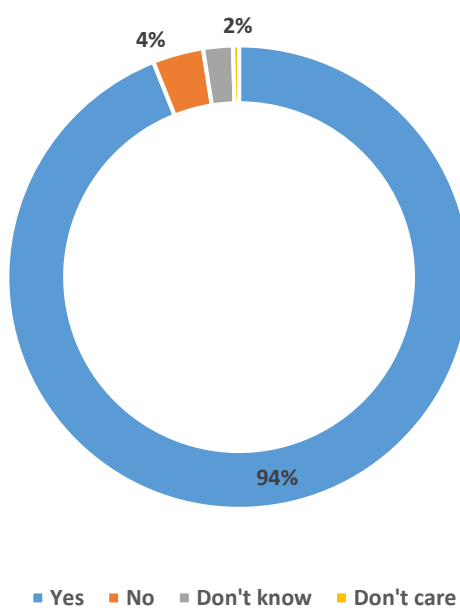

Figure 2: Are the possible road safety risks to Vulnerable Road Users



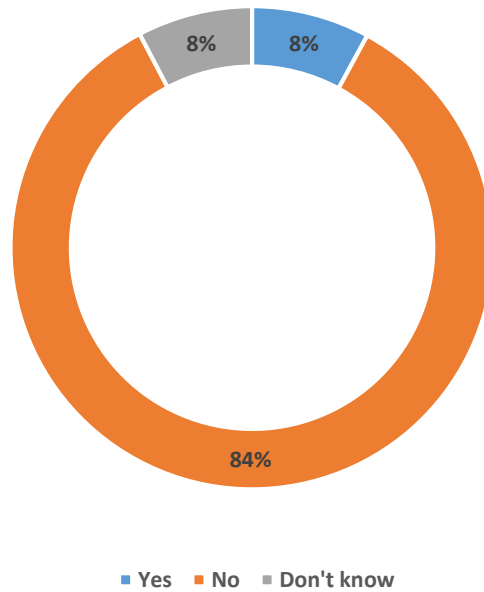

Figure 3: Do you consider the VISIBILITY of vulnerable road users to be a concern in South Africa



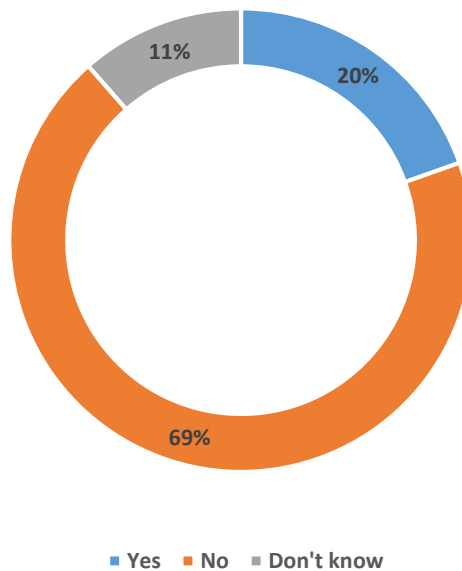

Figure 4: Do you feel enough is being done to highlight the importance of Road User Visibility in South Africa?

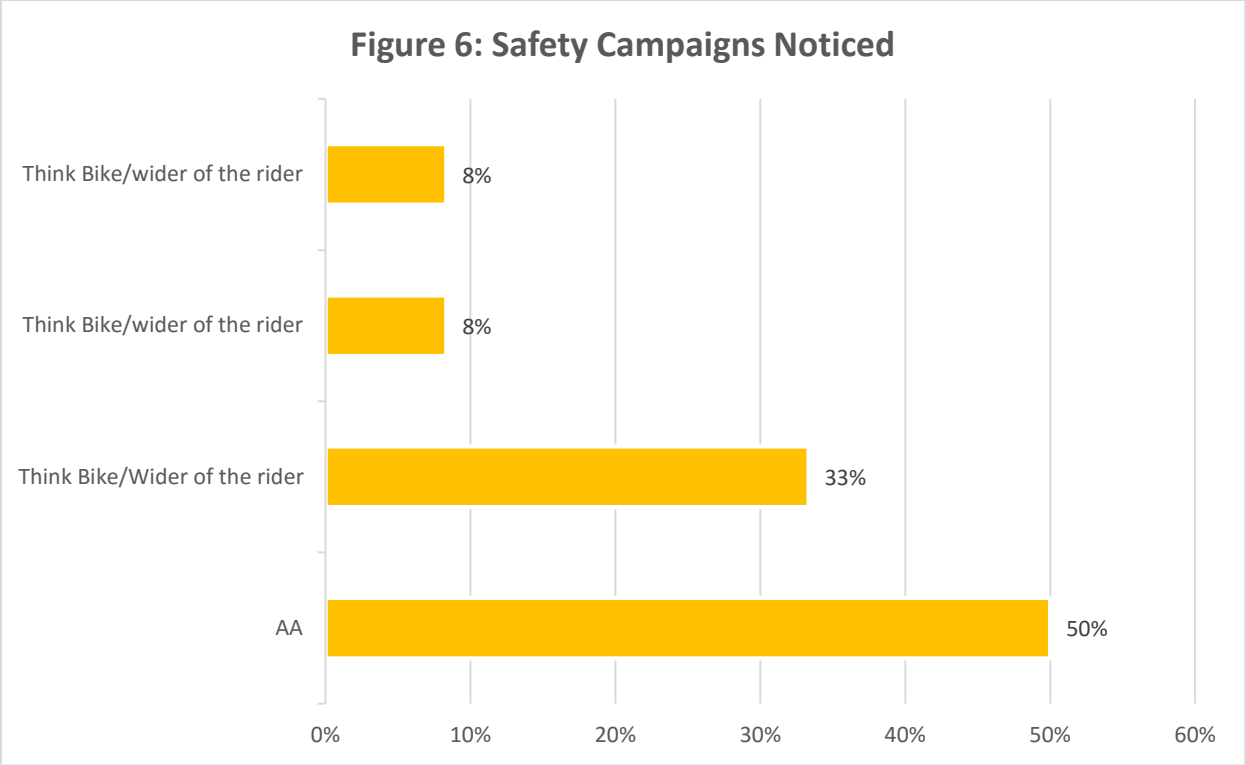

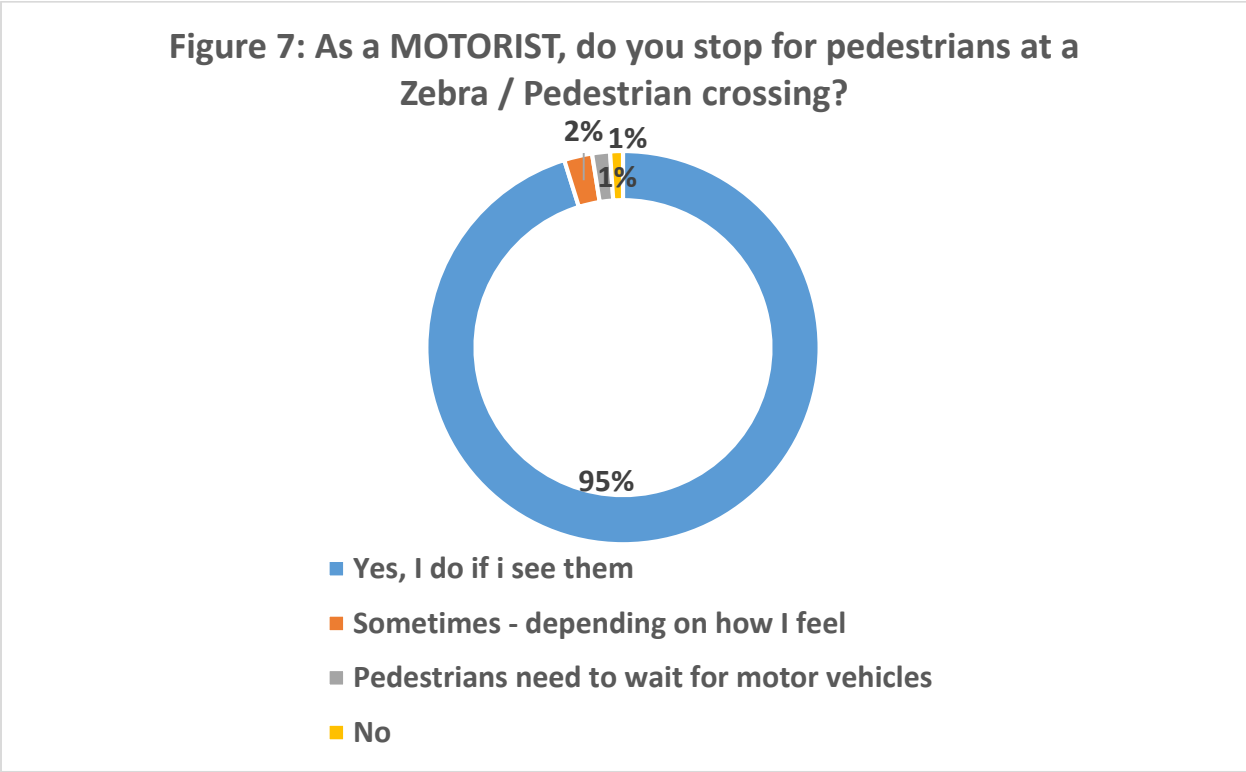
Figure 5: Are you aware of any safety campaigns highlighting the importance of Road User Visibility in South Africa?



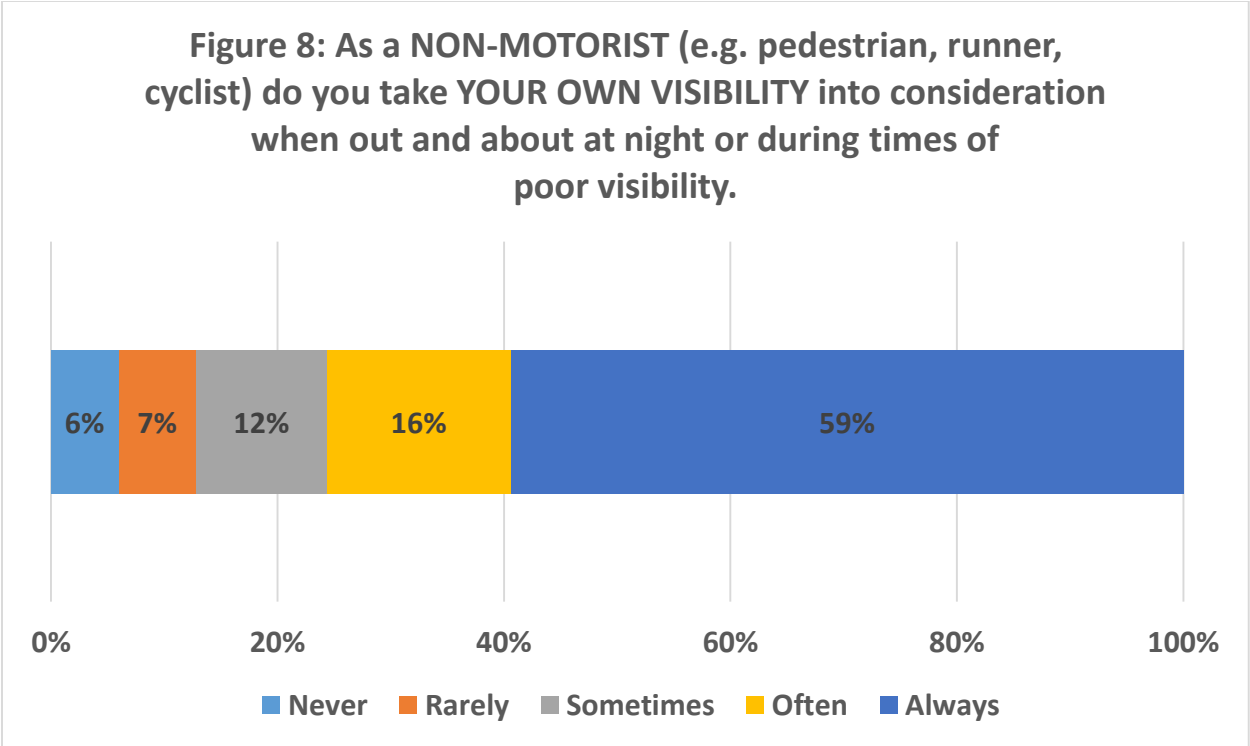

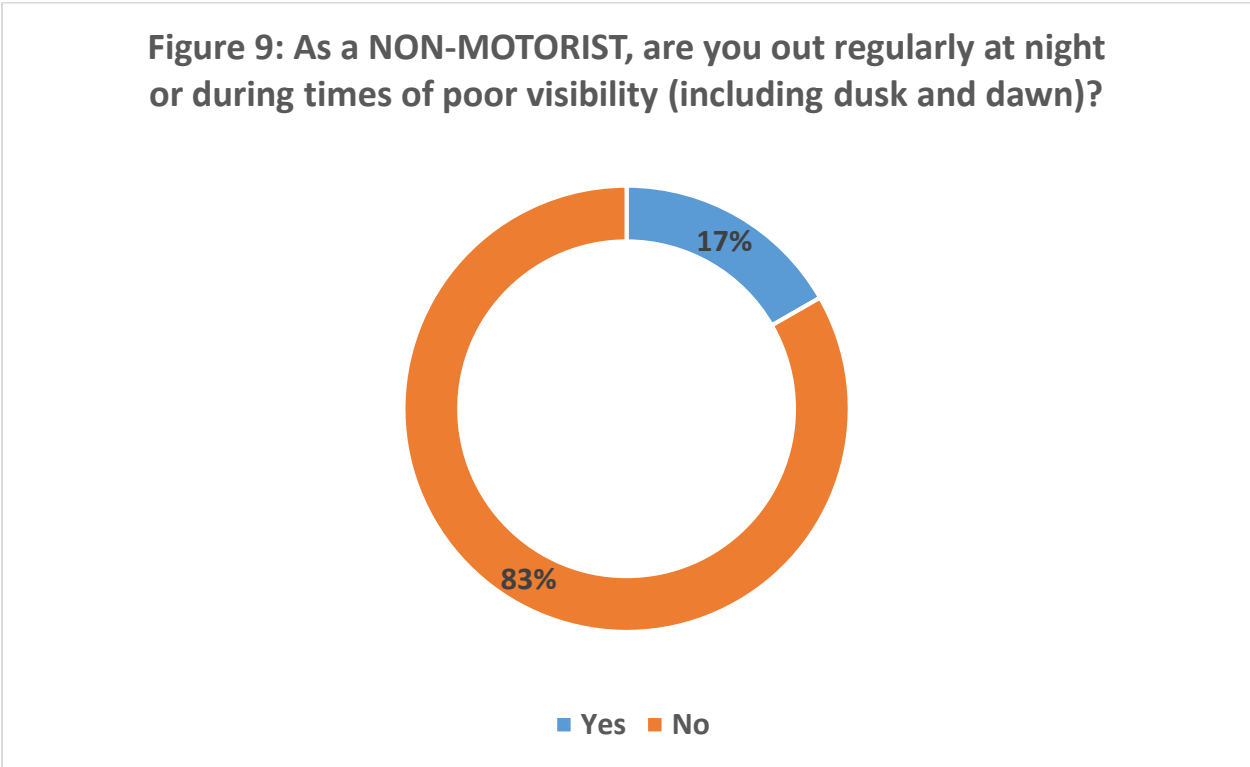

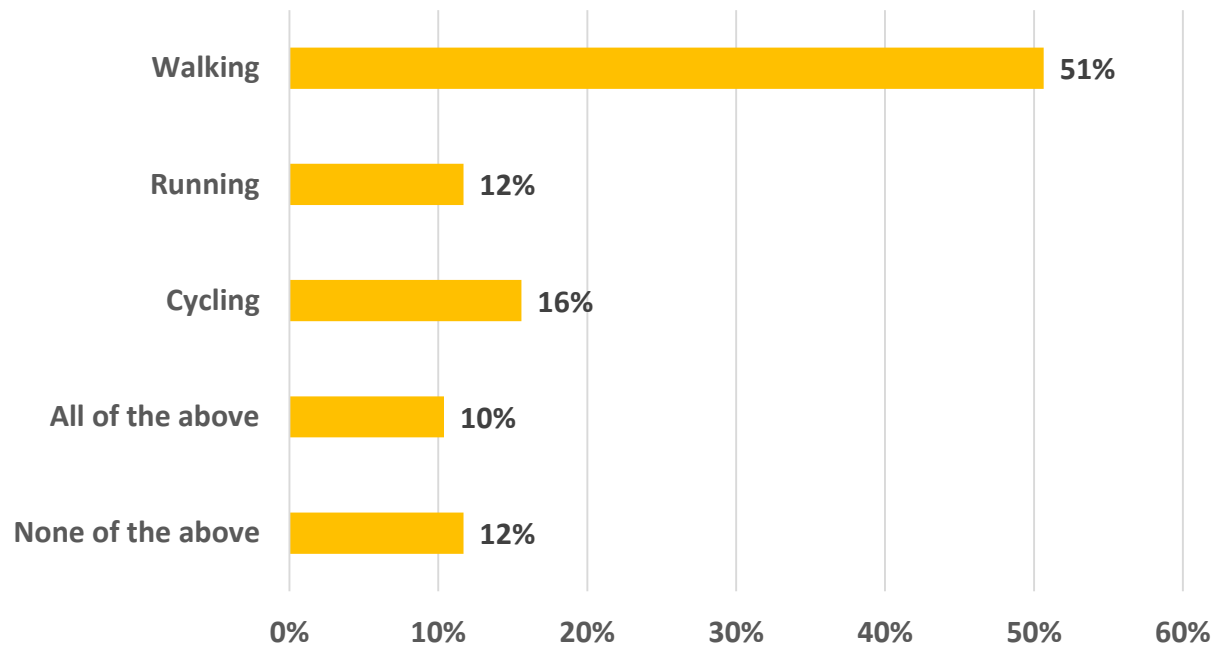

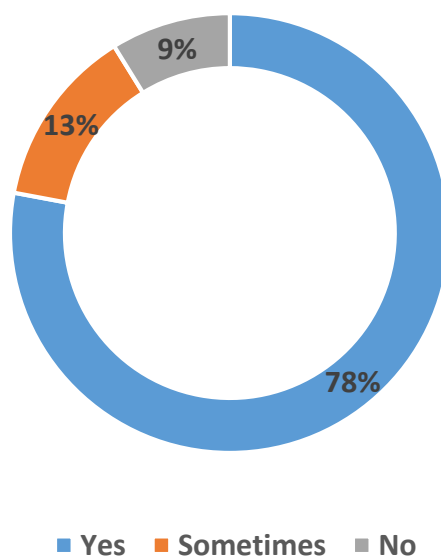

Figure 10: Do you do any of the following activities?



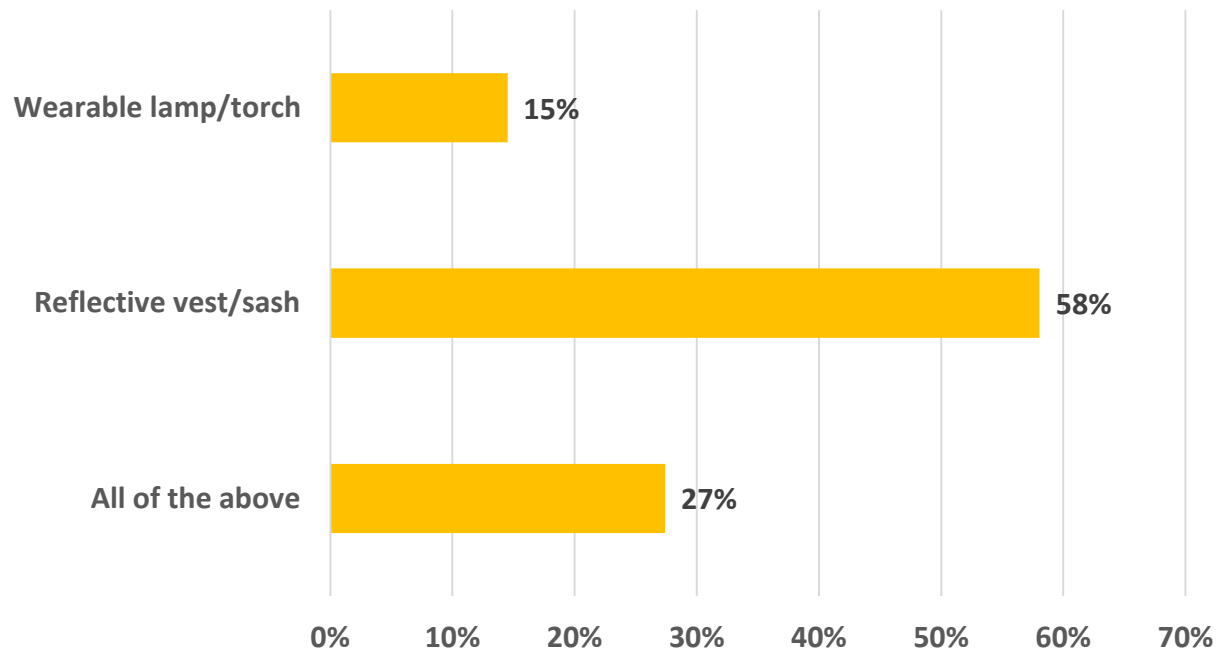

Figure 11: Do you make yourself more visible while taking part in these activities?



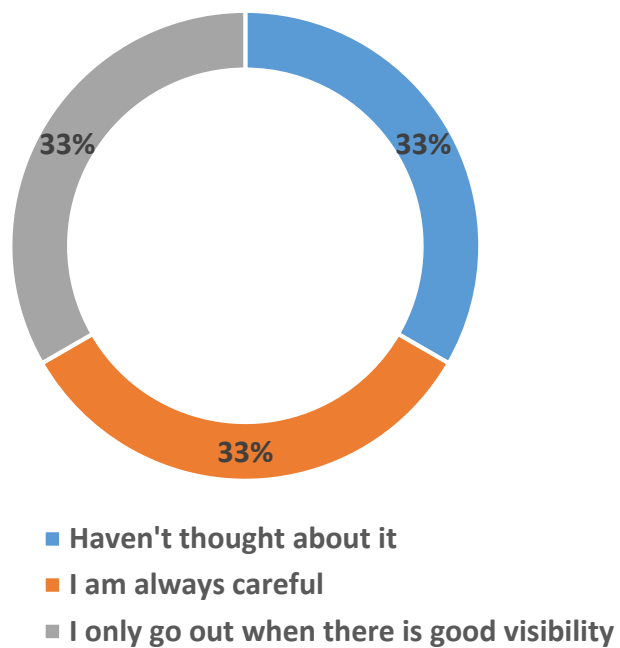

Figure 12: How do you make yourself more visible?



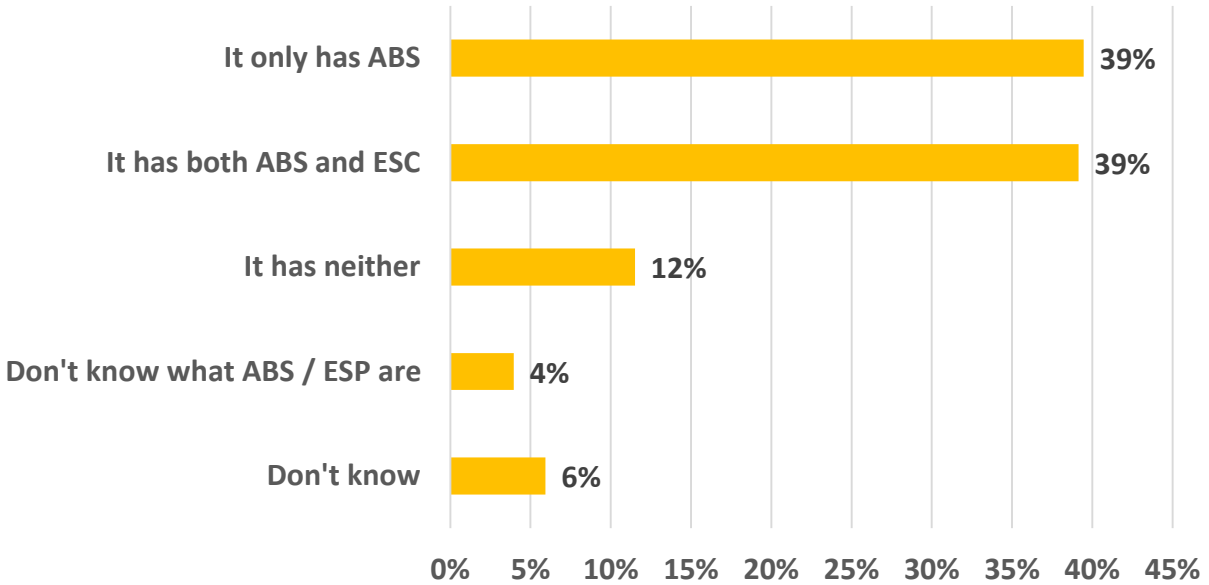

Figure 13: Why don't you make yourself more visible?



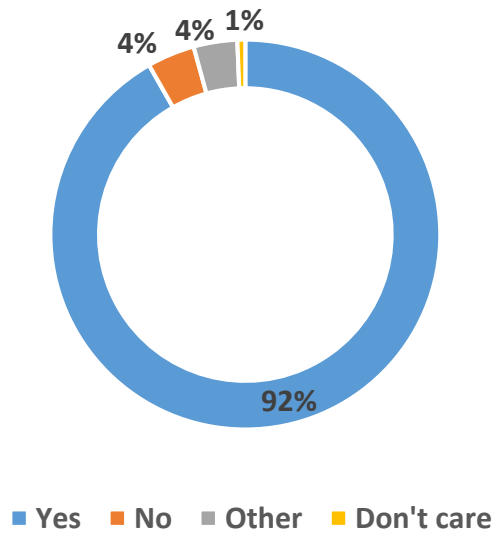

Figure 14: Does the current motor vehicle you drive have anti-lock braking system (ABS) and electronic stability control (ESC) installed?



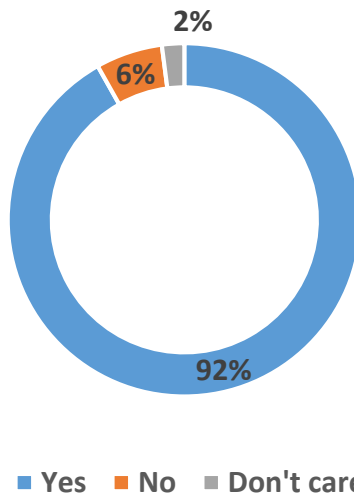
